





Music Festivals you'll love

Back for it's 16th year, the Belfast City Blues Festival is one of the biggest Blues RnB festivals on the island of Ireland. This festival has something for everyone with over 60 free gigs being played across the city over 3 days from 26–28 June.

If traditional music is more your taste, **Belfast Tradfest** returns to the city from the 27 July to 3 August. With world-class traditional music concerts, fiery pub sessions and Ireland's fastest growing summer school of traditional music.

Cultural events

Féile an Phobail, Eastside Arts Festival and Belfast Mela will be bringing colour and vibrancy across the city. The annual Eastside Arts Festival, running from 24 July – 2 August, showcases the brilliant creative talent that lies within East Belfast. With live music, comedy, theatre, talks and workshops and so much more to enjoy!

Féile an Phobail takes place from 31 July to 10 August and is Ireland's biggest community arts festival. With workshops, debates, family activities, visual arts events and musical concerts.

Experience a week long programme of music, dance, food and art when the **Belfast Mela** returns from the 16 to 24 August. Major events include the Mela Carnival when the carnival parade brings the



party to the city centre and the Mela Day taking place in Botanic Gardens.

If tours are more your vibe, Belfast has great walking tours to experience. Take the popular **Belfast Music Walking Tour** that will introduce you to many of the city's music legends, learn about Belfast's rich musical heritage, tradition and roots.

If punk music is more your genre, why not join the **Belfast Punk Music Walking Tour**. Learn about the Good Vibrations record shop and label, the punk bands of the late 1970s and today's modern punk bands.

With two professional musicians as your guides, the Belfast Traditional Music Trail will take you through cobbled alleyways, past famous landmarks and on to private bars in some of the city's oldest buildings.

At each stop you will be treated to a performance of traditional tunes, songs and stories.

LUCIAN FREUD'S ETCHINGS: A CREATIVE COLLABORATION

In partnership with the Victoria and Albert Museum, Titanic Belfast presents Lucian Freud Etchings: A Creative Collaboration, a free exhibition in the Andrews Gallery until 30 September.

Belfast is the first stop on its global tour and the only location on

the island of Ireland to host the exhibition. It showcases highlights from a rare collection of etchings, many exhibited for the first time. The trial proofs highlight Freud's collaboration with master printer Marc Balakijan, includina the contemplative "Donegal Man" (2007), featuring Pat Doherty, Titanic Belfast's Chairman.

The exhibition also offers an immersive experience into Freud's printmaking process, with commentary from



V&A curator Gill Saunders, Freud's assistant David Dawson, and a rare appearance by Freud himself, providing insight into his precise etching techniques.

The city's most famous gay club is probably Kremlin on Donegall Street. A Soviet-style industrial opulence exudes throughout the venue's extravagant decor, with the Tsar Cocktail Lounge, the Long Bar and Red Square continuing the communist-chic vibe. kremlin-belfast.com

Belfast LGBT Centre

The Belfast LGBT Centre is located at 23-31 Waring Street in Belfast's Cathedral Quarter, which houses a number of charities including the Rainbow Project and Cara Friend, providing counselling, befriending, information and a health and social space for the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community.

Belfast Pride Festival

Belfast Pride is the biggest LGBTQIA+ festival on the island of Ireland and it packs in over 150 events across ten days! The city will vet again burst into a rainbow of colour this summer, with Belfast City Hall lighting up in rainbow colours to celebrate Pride Dav. This year's festival theme is Stand By Your Trans and is a celebration packed with a variety of events from film and music to drama and debate. This year the unmissable Pride Parade makes its way through the city centre on Saturday 26th July at 1pm. belfastpride.com









SINCLAIR SEAMEN'S CHURCH

Built by Charles Lanyon in 1857-58 to meet the spiritual needs of visiting sailors, this part church, part maritime museum has a pulpit shaped like a ship's prow, a brass ship's wheel and binnacle (used as a baptismal font) salvaged from a WWI wreck and the ship's bell from HMS Hood.

BELFAST HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS This stunning building dates

back to 1847, and you can visit an exhibition in the Heritage Room which celebrates 400 vears of Belfast's maritime history, detailing Belfast's emergence as a major port and the city's subsequent growth and development as an industrial hub.

CLARENDON DOCK & CITY QUAYS

The dry dock where Belfast's Shipbuilding industry was born date back to 1800-1826. The area has now been transformed into the City Quays development, home to a mix of commercial office, shops, cafes and restaurants.

THE BIG FISH

The beautiful blue scales on the Salmon of Knowledge (affectionately known as The Big Fish) are made up of ceramic tiles depicting scenes from the city's history. Legend has it that if you kiss the fish you'll gain all of its wisdom!

LAGAN WEIR

A wide, modern foot and cycle bridge connecting the city centre with Titanic Quarter. Beautifully illuminated in the evening, take a seat and enjoy the views of the city from the River Lagan.

LFAST BUOYS

The three buoys are estimated to be around 80 years old, and would have been used by mariners to find a safe channel to and from port. Recently restored to their original colours, they have been installed as a permanent display at Abercorn Basin.

SS NOMADICThe last remaining White Star Line vessel, SS Nomadic, has been restored to her original glory and is back home in the historic Hamilton Dock, near Titanic Belfast, Come on board and experience over 100 years of authentic maritime and social history.

Get ready to see more, hear more and feel more at the reimagined Titanic Experience! With the launch of four exciting new themed galleries, guests will delve deeper into a reflective journey of the hopes and dreams of those impacted by the iconic ship. @ VP

TITANIC &

OLYMPIC SLIPWAYS Behind Titanic Belfast you'll find the historic slipways where these famous ships were built and launched over a hundred years ago. Containing many original features, a Memorial Garden illustrates the proportion of Titanic's victims and survivors from each of the passenger classes and crew.

TITANIC HOTEL BELFAST

The original red brick building is a truly authentic part of Titanic's story. Harland and Wolff had two main drawing offices within the building. Drawing Office Two is now the vibrant heart of the hotel where you can relax and enjoy lunch, dinner or even a cocktail or two. This breathtaking room is where many of the world's most famous ocean liners, including RMS Titanic, were painstakingly designed.

THE GREAT LIGHT

This former lighthouse optic is a unique heritage object with significance to Belfast's economic industrial maritime past. Originally serving both Mew and Tory Island lighthouses, the optic is the largest of its kind ever constructed and dates back to 1887. It is lit all year round and has amazing views over Belfast Harbour and Lough.

TITANIC DISTILLERY

In the heart of the Maritime Mile. Thompson Dock and Pumphouse - the home of Titanic Distillers. Inspired by the people who worked in Belfast's shipvards more than a century ago - you will now be able to walk in their footsteps in the very pump-house and dry dock that represents such an authentic part of the Titanic story and indeed the history of Belfast. HMS CAROLINE

Step on board HMS Caroline and experience an incredible day out that the whole family can enjoy. Explore this WW1 ship, get hands on with a variety of interactive exhibits and take part in some family friendly activities.






GAELTACHT QUARTER

Giants Causeway

Carrick-A-Rede Rope Bridge

Suspended almost 30m (100ft) above sea level, the rope bridge was first erected by salmon fishermen over 200 years ago. Hillsborough Castle




Hill of The O'Neill & Ranfurly House

With longer days and landscapes in full bloom, summer is the perfect time to explore Ards and North Down. A region where rolling green landscapes meet windswept shores, history and heritage blend with fresh adventure, and every bite and view leaves a lasting impression.

Located just 30 minutes from Belfast and two hours from Dublin, this picturesque pocket of Northern Ireland promises everything from serene seaside escapes and revitalising outdoor pursuits to vibrant towns bursting with culture, food, and character.

Timeless heritage by the sea

History echoes through villages and vistas in Ards and North Down. In **Groomsport**, the lovingly restored 17th-century **Cockle Row Cottages** offer a glimpse into the lives of traditional fishermen and their families. Step inside and you'll find an exhibition capturing life in the 1800s, while outside, seasonal activities engage visitors young and old.

Meanwhile, the **North Down Museum** in Bangor offers
an immersive dive into the
region's ancient roots—from

Viking invaders to early monastic traditions.

If your idea of bliss is a bracing coastal walk, the North Down Coastal Path should be top of your list. Winding from Holywood to Orlock Point just outside Donaghadee, this scenic trail serves up panoramic views across Belfast Lough. Along the way, stop off in charming villages like Helen's Bay and Crawfordsburn or take the kids to Pickie Funpark in Bangor for pedal swans, mini golf, and a ride on the Pickie Puffer train.

Travel to **Nendrum Monastic Site** on Mahee Island near
Comber. These peaceful 5thcentury ruins sit in a spellbinding



setting overlooking Strangford Lough, widely regarded as the finest example of a pre-Norman Christian settlement in Northern Ireland.

No heritage tour would be complete without a stop at **Scrabo Tower**. Rising above Newtownards, this iconic landmark rewards those who climb its hill with sweeping views across patchwork countryside and the shimmering lough below.

At the tip of the Ards Peninsula lies **Portaferry**, a postcard-perfect harbour town, home to **Exploris**, Northern Ireland's only aquarium, where marine life and seal rehabilitation efforts take centre stage.

Foodies will find plenty to savour, where the local food scene is as rich and varied as the landscape. Awardwinning restaurants and rustic cafés pride themselves on championing ingredients from the region—from the seasonal **Comber Earlies** potatoes (with PGI status) to the freshest **Portavogie** prawns hauled straight from the Irish Sea.

Whether you're in the mood for fish and chips by the harbour, fine dining in an elegant country house, or browsing artisan stalls at a local market, you'll find every meal tells a story of the land and sea that shaped it.

Getting around the city

There are many fascinating and beautiful places to visit in Belfast and Northern Ireland, and making your way around using public transport couldn't be easier, you can reach every county in a couple of hours.

WHICH SERVICE?

Metro – Bus services operating throughout the Belfast area. Metro and Glider tickets are interchangeable and can be used on both services.



Glider – A cross-city service, G1 runs between east and west Belfast and G2 runs between Belfast City Centre and Titanic Quarter. Glider and Metro tickets are interchangeable and can be used on both services.

* Before you board Glider you must always buy your ticket or tap your Smartcard at the validator.

Ulsterbus and Urby -

Local bus services, serving all main towns and villages in Northern Ireland.

Goldliner – Express coach services which link together the main towns and cities across Northern Ireland.

NI Railways / Enterprise -

Rail Services across Northern Ireland and from Belfast to Dublin.






